

“...impact comes in different forms and to track the cycles of social change work, we must think across the tangibility and the speed of emergence of change.”




WE ARE BASED IN SHARED VALUES OF EQUITY, COMPASSION & HOPE





"I am a physical therapist assistant that works full time; I have been having a lot of child care struggles...Our children are forced to be home from school right now and our jobs are forcing us to be at work right now, so something's got to give. "I feel daycare providers may sacrifice their health, and their family's health, for financial income. In simple words we are afraid to turn children away who may be sick due to having to pay our bills."


"We don't have insurance in case we the providers get sick. How can we provide for our family and the community. Without childcare no parent would be able to work."

"Regulations with group size restrictions, stability of teachers, and stability of groups made it virtually impossible for us to remain open without financial help. I felt like we were put in an impossible situation."

"I have 14 children and all of my teaching essentials come out of my wages and living expenses...Being able to deliver a superb curriculum comes when one has the right tools to carry that out."


- Measure H City of San Diego facilities for child care
